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

WHERE WERE WE?

- Very little or No level of awareness on Rhesus factor amongst the populace and even community birth attendants
- Little or no access to good health facilities and inadequate counseling where they exist
- Lack of Interest on the part of Government and Agencies based on assumption of low prevalence of Rhesus negativity, hence no policies, support and/or funding
- Trauma and stigmatization due to repeated loss of pregnancies and babies which may eventually lead to broken marriages and homes.
- Wrong typing of blood group and rhesus status due to human error or deficient materials



WHERE WERE WE? Contd.

Unaffordability and Inaccessibility of Rhogam injection. The cost of a vial is almost twice the minimum wage/PM
2009: Cost of Rhogam: N13, 000 (\$81) Minimum wage/PM in Nigeria: N7500 (\$47)
2015: N19, 000 (\$83) N18, 000 (\$78)
2018: N32, 000 (\$88) N18, 000 (\$49)

COUNSELLING

- Over 3000 rhesus negative women have benefitted from free counseling (one on one) at the RSI office.
- 58% came with their husbands for the counseling



INTERVENTION: DONATION OF FREE RHOGAM

Over 1600 FREE Rhogam injections donated across different Health facilities





INTERVENTION

FREE BLOOD GROUP AND RHESUS STATUS TEST: Over 5000 people tested and issued blood Group card





TRAINING

VOLUNTEERS: Over 50 volunteers trained.



TRADITIONAL BIRTH ATTENDANTS: over 500 TBAs, RBAs and CBAs trained

RESEARCH

No published National data on Rhesus negative prevalence or burden of the disease in Nigeria due to insufficient research, awareness, training, support platforms and feedback mechanisms.

• From our field testing in Lagos, 323 of 5,420 people tested were Rh negative. (RSI DATA)
