Ban introduced to protect against vCJD has been lifted to increase stocks of immunoglobin

How UK plasma will benefit Europe



ISSUE

Current **reliance of EEA/EU Member States on 3**rd **country plasma imports**, in particular from the US, represents a risk to the region and to global plasma supply

This has been **exacerbated by COVID-19** – future infectious diseases would further impact the plasma supply needed for PMDPs

PDMP availability is primarily dependent on volumes of plasma collected, which are **currently insufficient to meet the needs of EU patients**.

The **US** is facing its worst blood and plasma shortage in more than a decade due to COVID and bad weather conditions – this may cause a ripple effect in Europe

UK PLASMA



NHSBT is aiming to collect around <u>1 million litres</u> of plasma between FY22/23 – FY25-26, which will <u>ease</u> the pressure on European plasma supply
